Management's Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition and Results of Operations

Overview

The robotic platform for the food and beverage industry.

Milestones

Yummy Future Inc. was incorporated in the State of Delaware in September 2018.

Since then, we have:

- 2026 YTD revenue: \$650,632 vs. \$278,043 in the same period last year, up 134.0%.
- Last 12 months: \$997,034 in revenue, up 105.2% year over year.
- Matcha House lifted weekly sales from ~\$3,400 to ~\$10,000 (~3X) with no hardware change.

- 63% gross margin (FY2024, audited).
- \$4.71M raised to date; backed by YC, Soma Capital, Asymmetry Ventures, and Trevor Blackwell.
- Lifetime revenue: \$1,735,848 across 213,291 orders; average order value: \$8.14
- Best day: \$7,245 and 1,000+ drinks across three stores, mostly with one barista each.

Historical Results of Operations

- *Revenues & Gross Margin.* For the period ended December 31, 2025, the Company had revenues of \$554,212 compared to the year ended December 31, 2024, when the Company had revenues of \$414,341. Our gross margin was 59.24% in fiscal year 2025, and 63.06% in 2024.
- *Assets.* As of December 31, 2025, the Company had total assets of \$1,616,000, including \$258,954 in cash. As of December 31, 2024, the Company had \$2,131,771 in total assets, including \$869,228 in cash.
- *Net Loss.* The Company has had net losses of \$1,217,816 and net losses of \$890,785 for the fiscal years ended December 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024, respectively.
- *Liabilities.* The Company's liabilities totaled \$627,097 for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2025 and \$895,775 for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2024.

Liquidity & Capital Resources

To-date, the company has been financed with \$13,440 in debt and \$3,546,590 in SAFEs.

After the conclusion of this Offering, should we hit our minimum funding target, our projected runway is 100 months before we need to raise further capital.

We plan to use the proceeds as set forth in this Form C under "Use of Funds". We don't have any other sources of capital in the immediate future.

We will likely require additional financing in excess of the proceeds from the Offering in order to perform operations over the lifetime of the Company. We plan to raise capital in 18 months. Except as otherwise described in this Form C, we do not have additional sources of capital other than the proceeds from the offering. Because of the complexities and uncertainties in establishing a new business strategy, it is not possible to adequately project whether the proceeds of this offering will be sufficient to enable us to implement our strategy. This complexity and uncertainty will be increased if less than the maximum amount of securities offered in this offering is sold. The

the maximum amount of securities offered in this offering is sold. The Company intends to raise additional capital in the future from investors. Although capital may be available for early-stage companies, there is no guarantee that the Company will receive any investments from investors.

Runway & Short/Mid Term Expenses

Yummy Future Inc. cash in hand is \$300,000, as of August 2026. Over the last three months, revenues have averaged \$86,025.67/month, cost of goods sold has averaged \$18,873.42/month, and operational expenses have averaged \$112,915.53/month, for an average burn rate of \$45,763.28 per month. Our intent is to be profitable in 12 months.

We launched our Wefunder crowdfunding campaign since the date our financials cover. Our revenue increased by \$600K - \$800K annually thanks to the opening of our third coffee shop location in Palo Alto.

Revenue will be \$150K - \$200K monthly in the next 3-6 months due to the new opening of our third locations along with early sign ups of franchisees. We expect monthly expenses for the next 3-6 months to be around \$100K-\$120K.

To achieve profitability, we estimate that an additional \$2 million in funding is required. This investment will support our expansion efforts and the development of our franchise model through the following key initiatives:

Expanding Operations & Driving ARR to \$3M

We opened our third and plan for fourth locations to expand our customer base and increase revenue. This growth is expected to drive Annual Recurring Revenue (ARR) to \$3 million, with an estimated \$800K in profit. These locations will serve as flagship showcases for our robotic coffee solutions, attracting both customers and potential franchisees.

Franchise Expansion

To accelerate our footprint and diversify revenue streams, we are actively onboarding franchisees. Our franchise revenue model includes: franchise fees per location, royalty fees based on gross sales, marketing contributions to enhance brand visibility and subscription fees for POS & robotic service. Expanding our franchise network will be instrumental in scaling operations and driving long-term profitability. With the necessary funding in place, we expect to achieve profitability within 12 months, fueled by revenue growth from company-operated locations and franchise expansion.

Reduce R&D expense due to major features of the robotic system are completed

Commercial deployments validated our robotic system in real operating conditions. With the platform and store workflows now largely stable, we plan to reduce R&D spending and shift resources toward sales and partner development. This should lower cash burn while engineers focus on reliability, software updates, and routine maintenance. We've diversified our capital sources. In addition to the funds raised on Wefunder, we also have our parallel round for investors who write bigger checks or don't want to use wefunder.com to invest. Regarding short-term burn, while we are not yet profitable, we are actively leveraging revenue from existing locations, securing franchise pre-sales and deposits, and optimizing costs strategically. Simultaneously, our growth initiatives—opening two additional coffee shop locations and expanding our franchise network—are expected

to accelerate revenue generation and further reduce our burn rate in the coming months.

All projections in the above narrative are forward-looking and not guaranteed.

The Lead Investor. As described above, each Investor that has entered into the Investor Agreement will grant a power of attorney to make voting decisions on behalf of that Investor to the Lead Investor (the "Proxy"). The Proxy is irrevocable unless and until a Successor Lead Investor takes the place of the Lead Investor, in which case, the Investor has a five (5) calendar day period to revoke the Proxy. Pursuant to the Proxy, the Lead Investor or his or her successor will make voting decisions and take any other actions in connection with the voting on Investors' behalf.

The Lead Investor is an experienced investor that is chosen to act in the role of Lead Investor on behalf of Investors that have a Proxy in effect. The Lead Investor will be chosen by the Company and approved by Wefunder Inc. and the identity of the initial Lead Investor will be disclosed to Investors before Investors make a final investment decision to purchase the securities related to the Company.

The Lead Investor can quit at any time or can be removed by Wefunder Inc. for cause or pursuant to a vote of investors as detailed in the Lead Investor Agreement. In the event the Lead Investor quits or is removed, the Company will choose a Successor Lead Investor who must be approved by Wefunder Inc. The identity of the Successor Lead Investor will be disclosed to Investors, and those that have a Proxy in effect can choose to either leave such Proxy in place or revoke such Proxy during a 5-day period beginning with notice of the replacement of the Lead Investor.

The Lead Investor will not receive any compensation for his or her services to the SPV. The Lead Investor may receive compensation if, in the future, Wefunder Advisors LLC forms a fund ("Fund") for accredited investors for the purpose of investing in a non-Regulation Crowdfunding offering of the Company. In such as circumstance, the Lead Investor may act as a portfolio manager for that Fund (and as a supervised person of Wefunder Advisors) and may be compensated through that role.

Although the Lead Investor may act in multiple roles with respect to the Company's offerings and may potentially be compensated for some of its services, the Lead Investor's goal is to maximize the value of the Company and therefore maximize the value of securities issued by or related to the Company. As a result, the Lead Investor's interests should always be aligned with those of Investors. It is, however, possible that in some limited circumstances the Lead Investor's interests could diverge from the interests of Investors, as discussed in section 8 above.

- (a) a description of the material content of such information;*
