NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Savile Capital Markets LLC (the “Company”), fka Trade Capital Markets LLC, a limited liability company, was organized in the State of Wyoming. The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Savile Capital Group, LLC (the “Parent”). The Company is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) and a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. (“FINRA”). The Company is engaged in business as a securities broker-dealer. All transactions for the Company’s customers are cleared through clearing broker-dealers on a fully disclosed basis.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting - The Company maintains its books and records on the accrual basis of accounting for financial reporting purposes, which is in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles and is required by the SEC and FINRA. The financial statements include only the assets and liabilities of the Company and are not combined with the related companies. Regulatory requirements require that the broker-dealer of securities be reported separately.

Cash and cash equivalents – The Company considers cash in banks and all highly liquid debt instruments with maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts. The Company believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash.

Revenue recognition – The Company recognizes revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services. The guidance requires an entity to follow a five-step model to (a) identify the contract(s) with a customer, (b) identify the performance obligations in the contract, (c) determine the transaction price, (d) allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations in the contract, and (e) recognize revenue when (or as) the entity satisfies a performance obligation. In determining the transaction price, an entity may include variable consideration only to the extent that it is probable that a significant reversal in the amount of cumulative revenue recognized would not occur when the uncertainty associated with the variable consideration is resolved.

The Company buys and sells securities on behalf of its customers. Each time a customer enters into a buy or sell transactions, the Company charges a commission and or markups. Commissions and related clearing expenses are recorded on the trade date. The Company believes that the performance obligation is satisfied on the trade date because that is when the underlying financial instrument or purchaser is identified, the pricing is agreed upon and the risks and rewards of ownership of the securities have been transferred to/from the customer. Fee based brokerage income is recognized at month end as performance obligations are met. Other fees include credits earned by the Company from its clearing broker-dealer and are recognized as earned. The Company offers no warranty, guarantees or refunds.

Use of accounting estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain assets and liabilities and disclosures. Accordingly, the actual amounts could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to the estimated amounts are recognized in the year in which such adjustments are determined.

Advertising – The Company policy is to expense advertising as incurred.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES(CONTINUED)

Income taxes – The Company is a limited liability company treated as a disregarded entity. Accordingly, in lieu of Federal and state income taxes, the member is taxed on their proportionate share of the Company's taxable income. Therefore, no provision or liability for Federal or state taxes has been included in these financial statements. The Company's sole member's tax return remains subject to examination by the appropriate taxing jurisdiction for tax years ending after December 31, 2023.

NOTE 3 – CONCENTRATIONS AND CREDIT RISK

The Company is engaged in various trading and brokerage activities in which counterparties primarily include broker-dealers, banks, and other financial institutions. In the event counterparties do not fulfill their obligations, the Company may be exposed to risk. The risk of default depends on the creditworthiness of the counterparty or issuer of the instrument. It is the Company's policy to review, as necessary, the credit standing of each counterparty.

As of June 30, 2026 the Company's cash in bank did not exceed federally insured limits.

NOTE 4 – CLEARING BROKER

The Company has entered into a Fully Disclosed Clearing Agreement's with StoneX Financial Inc. and RBC Capital Markets, LLC ("Clearing Brokers"). The Clearing Brokers carries cash and margin accounts of the customers introduced by the Company and clears transactions on a fully disclosed basis for such accounts. In addition, the Clearing Brokers are responsible for carrying, maintaining and preserving such books and records pertaining to its function as a Clearing Brokers pursuant to the requirements of Rules 17a-3 and 17a-4 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. At June 30, 2026, the amount due from the Clearing Brokers was \$425,510, as stated in the statement of financial condition, which includes cash with clearing brokers of \$302,490 and \$123,020 due from clearing. The Company considers due from broker to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for credit loss is required.

NOTE 5 – NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENT

The Company is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. Rule 15c3-1 also provides that equity capital may not be withdrawn or cash dividends paid if the resulting net capital; ratio would exceed 10 to 1. At June 30, 2026, the Company had net capital of \$252,841, which was \$241,041 in excess of its required net capital of \$11,800. The Company's percentage of indebtedness to net capital was 70.00%.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company has an Expense Sharing Agreement ("Agreement") with its Parent. Pursuant to the agreement, the Company shares administrative, occupancy and other management and back-office services. For the year ended June 30, 2026, expenses allocated for these services provided to the Company totaled \$1,383,868.

As of June 30, 2026, \$8,955 was due to Parent, as stated on the statement of financial condition. The amount due to Parent represents the remaining balance after applying all Expense Sharing Agreement allocations during the year, less payments made.

NOTE 7 – COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The Company does not have any commitments, guarantees or contingencies including arbitration or other litigation claims that may result in a loss or future obligation. The Company is not aware of any threats or other circumstances that may lead to the assertion of a claim at a future date.

NOTE 8 – SEGMENT REPORTING

The Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2023-07 issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) introduced enhancements to segment reporting requirements for public entities, including broker-dealers. The update aimed to improve the transparency and usefulness of financial disclosures for investors and other stakeholders. ASU 2023-07 disclosure requirements are effective for fiscal years starting after December 15, 2023.

The Company operates as a single line of business as a securities broker-dealer, which is comprised of investment banking and advisory work. The Company has identified its Chief Compliance Officer as the Chief Operating Decision Maker (“CODM”) as specified in ASU 2023-07, who uses net income to evaluate the results of the business, predominantly in the forecasting process, to manage the Company. Additionally, the CODM uses excess net capital, which is not a measure of profit and loss, to make operational decisions while maintaining capital adequacy, such as whether to reinvest profits or pay distributions.

The Company’s operations constitute a single operating segment and therefore, a single reporting segment, because the CODM manages the business activities using information of the Company as a whole. The accounting policies used to measure the profit and loss of the segment are the same as those described in the summary of significant accounting policies. Company management reviewed the ASU 2023-07 disclosure requirements and determined that no additional disclosures are required as the Company has only a single reportable segment.

NOTE 9 – FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS – CREDIT LOSSES

The Company accounts for estimated credit losses on financial assets measured at an amortized cost basis and certain off-balance sheet credit exposures in accordance with FASB ASC 326-20, *Financial instruments – Credit Losses*. FASB ASC 326-20 requires the Company to estimate expected credit losses over the life of its financial assets and certain off-balance sheet exposures as of the reporting date based on relevant information about past events, current conditions, and reasonable and supportable forecasts. The Company records the estimate of expected credit losses as an allowance for credit losses. The Company estimates expected credit losses to receivables over the life of the financial asset as of the reporting date based on relevant information about past events, current conditions, and reasonable and supportable forecasts. The Company did not record an allowance at June 30, 2026

NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In accordance with FASB Accounting Standards Codification 855, Subsequent Events, the Company has evaluated subsequent events to the Statement of Financial Position date of June 30, 2026 through September 25, 2026, which is the date the financial statements were issued. Management has determined that there are no subsequent events that require disclosure or adjustment the the financial statements.
